

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LEONVILLE, LOUISIANA, TAKEN AT A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, AUGUST 09, 2022, AT 6:00 PM IN THE MEETING ROOM OF THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING.

The regular meeting of the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Leonville was held on Tuesday, August 09, 2022, at 6:00 PM in the meeting room of the Municipal Building.

The mayor called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Nicholas Degueyter and Council Members Benita Kennerson, Brandon Herpin, Billy Lanclos, and Kerry Willingham. Absent was Kirk Stelly

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

It was moved by Kerry Willingham, seconded by Billy Lanclos and carried that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be dispensed with and accepted as written.

Audrey Rayme addressed the council concerning high water bill. History was run showing leak at 188 Brennan St, informed that leak adjustment can be completed and submitted.

Fete Dieu du Teche will be on August 15, boats will begin launching at 6 am. Any volunteers would be appreciated.

Cleveland Auzenne Jr received Ordinances concerning subdivision/apartment complex construction for possible future development.

On a motion by Kerry Willingham, seconded by Benita Kennerson and carried to continue support by accepting the La Dept of Veterans Affairs CEA.

On a motion by Brandon Herpin, seconded by Billy Lanclos and carried to approve the Amendment to the Sellers & Associates Owner-Engineer Agreement for the Boat Launch Facility Improvements, Phase 2.

Chief Joseph Noel III requested to hire another officer since one did resign. On a motion by Brandon Herpin, seconded by Benita Kennerson and carried to allow Chief Noel to proceed to hire a new officer.

Lance Lee gave report, sanitary survey will begin this week, water tower altitude valve installation is complete, waiting on final invoice to request funds. Bihm Construction will be doing the bore on Hwy 103.

Lance Lee informed council of the low pressure by J. Michael Morrow Memorial Nursing Home when flushing in the area, requested a moratorium on new development until a new 6" line can be added from Bayou Acres to east end of system. On a motion from Kerry Willingham, seconded by Billy Lanclos and carried that any new construction on the 3" line is contingent on engineers' approval.

Lance Lee and Blake Davis gave update on Sewer Plant, staying in compliance but the return activated sludge box does need work and leak in clarifier.

Priority list of streets that need repair has been made, ditch digging is in process and gas system is working with PIP on reports.

Blake Davis requested there be a meeting in April of next year to prepare for the 4th of July Fireworks and recruit volunteers to help.

Stephen Speyrer wanted to discuss his Entergy electric bill, gave information/contacts for Entergy, SLEMCO and Senator John Kennedy's office.

There being no further business, the meeting was declared adjourned.

The next regular meeting will be September 13, 2022.
